Better Grammar

Computer Voice Control

 Use a microphone to control your computer with voice recognition



- Speak to your computer and it types what you say using voice features in graphic organizers
- Turn difficult to understand handwriting into typed notes with handwriting recognition
- Record your notes and the audio of the lecture together
- Outlines & templates: features in graphic organizers



- Have the screen content read to you
- See what's on the screen better with magnifiers, tinting and masking
